








CARRIE C. Daughter of Abner B. & Clara Rich died May 4, 1864 AEt. 6 y's. 2 m's. 24 d's.

They were lovely in life and in death were not divided. Within the same casket, and locked in each others arms, they wait the morning of the resurrection. We deeply mourn our sudden loss.

The gravestone was cleaned with D/2 Biological Solution October 2011 for the Rich Family Association. Also see Abner B Rich 1892.



Part II: Tour

Stop 1: Old North Cemetery

Directions: From the Library, Right (south) onto Rt 6.

Go 1 mile

Turn left on Aldrich Rd, just past Shore Rd, before the cemetery.

Follow the fence that runs along the cemetery, and turn right into the shell-covered roadway at the back of the cemetery. Pull forward and park on any of the roadways.

Stop 2: Snow and Congregational Cemeteries

Directions: From Old North, left onto Rt 6. and go 1.9 miles

Turn Right on Truro Center Road

Turn Right on Town Hall Road (up the hill)

Turn left at the entrance to the Congregational Church (Meetinghouse)

Follow the dirt road (not the neighbor's driveway) that leads to the Meetinghouse.

ightarrow Notice on your right the marble obelisk – the Gale Memorial - commemorating

The 1841 storm during which 57 men and boys from Truro died

Continue around the circle toward sign "Snow Cemetery."

Enter the drive for Snow Cemetery and continue to the rear on the right fork (the cemetery road is a loop)

Stop 3: Pine Grove – Note: access is via a dirt road – approx. 4.5 miles from Snow Cemetery

Directions: From Snow Cemetery, turn right out the driveway at the Congregational Church and return to Rt. 6 Turn right onto Rt. 6 (toward Wellfleet)

Continue approx. 1.8 miles to orange "detour" sign at Prince Valley Rd.

Turn right onto Prince Valley Rd. and go 1.6 miles

At end, turn right onto Old County Rd. and go approx. 0.5 miles

Look for Pine Grove Cemetery sign on right – turn onto dirt road. Continue to end of dirt road.
