As requested in your letter of November 8, 2011 on PAL's Truro Inventory submittal of October 4, 2011, and as stated in PAL's response letter of December 1, 2011, enclosed are the revised pages for five area forms to match the submitted form sets previously delivered to the Town of Truro and the Massachusetts Historical Commission (MHC). In order to add the requested Google-based map locating individual resources in the area, each form package also includes an accompanying revised data table on continuation sheets. In addition, for TRU.E Corn Hill we made a change to the map on the cover sheet to match the new aerial map, and for TRU.Q Sladeville, we made additional revisions to incorporate information recently received from Chuck Steinman, Chair of the Truro Historical Commission, and one of the property owners who is interested in listing the area on the State and National Registers of Historic Places. There are no other changes, including to any of the continuation sheets with attached photographs, for these five areas. All the forms have been formatted and named per MHC guidelines.

- TRU.Q Sladeville – 7 sheets (revised cover sheet through revised data sheet, and new annotated aerial map)

- TRU.S Walsh Way – 2 sheets (revised data sheet and new annotated aerial map)
- TRU.T 95 Shore Road – 2 sheets (revised data sheet and new annotated aerial map)
