This is a vast collection of genealogical resources that is accessible from our in-house computers or from your own wireless device at the library. No complicated sign-ups or account set-ups, but remember you must be AT the Truro Public Library—no home access.

ZINIO

Zinio is access to 50 full-text magazines. Among the choices are business mags (i.e., Bloomberg, Forbes, Kiplinger) popular culture (i.e., Vanity Fair, Cosmo, Rolling Stone, Us), and many more. You can read the magazines in your internet browser or download the “app” and have them waiting for you.

INDIEFLIX
