#### **Department News:**

Police Department

- The date is closing in for the Truro Police Department Tip-a-Cop event at Montano's Restaurant. Members will be taking part in this wonderful charity event on Friday, April 5<sup>th</sup> from 4:30-9:30pm. The proceeds from this fundraiser help support the Special Olympics. We hope to see you there!
- Chief Calise attended the Friends of the Truro Library meeting on March 13<sup>th</sup> to meet with FOTL members and discuss happenings within the Truro Police Department. Thank you to all who attended and for the warm reception.
- Congratulations to Sergeant James Bragdon who was recently appointed to permanent status as a Truro Police Sergeant. Sergeant Bragdon had previously served as Acting Sergeant, beginning in October of 2018.

# Fire Department

- The Department responded to 4 requests for medical assistance, resulting in 3 transports to the hospital. In all we responded to a total of 8 calls that included inspectional services, general assistance, alarm activations and calls for public service and good intent calls.
- The Fire Department along with the, Truro Police Department, DPW, Beach and Recreation as well as the National Park service tested a patient transportation stretcher. This stretcher is designed to help evacuate individuals over sandy terrain. The cart was demonstrated at Longnook beach. The Town is planning to have the strategically located at beaches to more quickly get people of the beach to more definitive care.
- The Fire Department will be hosting a "Stop the Bleed "program at the Truro Public Safety facility. This program is open to all but seating is limited. You can enroll by emailing the Fire Chief (<u>tcollins@truro-ma.gov</u>) or calling the Fire Station.

#### Department of Public Works

- DPW crews have started the seasonal spring clean-up of roadsides and parking lots. During the next couple of weeks, the street sweeper will be out daily beginning in South Truro.
- The Corn Hill Beach Memorial has been cleaned up, and a new shell path access has been installed.
- The Farmers Market lawn area has been top dressed with loam, and grass seed will be added within the next couple of weeks. The split rail fence has also been extended, and a decorative gate will be added due to vehicles accessing, and parking, in the grass area.
- The Snows Park area is scheduled for a cleanup next week. We will be top dressing with loam and adding grass seed within a couple of weeks.
- The Swap Shop is on schedule to open May 4, 2019. We are still looking for volunteers to staff the hours of operation Saturday through Monday, 7:30am-3:00pm. Please contact the DPW at (508)214-0400 for details.
- April 1, 2019 road line painting will begin at 9:00pm, and end at 4:00am. Work will continue at the same time April 2, 2019 at 9:00pm, and end at 4:00am.
- The solid waste total, when compared to this time last year, has decreased approximately 60 tons and we have seen a 10 ton increase in single stream recycling when compared to last year.
- Beginning July 1, 2019 commercial yard waste will no longer be accepted at the Transfer Station. Residential homeowners can continue to deposit yard waste for free.
- East Harbor project is still moving along. MIG has been working around the tide, and weather. There have been no work stoppages the last couple of weeks. (photos attached).
- DOT has begun the bike lane improvements along Route 6 between Fisherman's Road and South Hollow Road. Please contact us if you would like to see the plans.

# Harbormaster/Shellfish Constable

- Harbor Master Jackett swept excessive shells and debris from the boat ramp for east of launching to minimize the chance of slicing trailer and vehicle tires.
- Attended Cape and Islands Harbormasters' meeting and discussed the current status of the county dredge which is now in Chatham and has been delayed because of breakdowns of equipment. We were informed that the survey boat had sunk and was still waiting for pipe. Concerns about the dredge being able to manage and keep a schedule was discussed, as towns are facing deadlines.
- There was a good turn-out over the weekend with shellfish harvesters enjoying the warm sunny afternoon as they gathered their limit.

- Beach fire permits for September 5, 2018 or later are issued at the Truro Fire Department.
- Warning Recent shark sightings, practice shark safety.
  - Don't swim where seals are present.
  - Don't swim too far from shore.
  - Swim in groups.
  - Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to a shark).
  - Avoid surfing alone.
  - Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
  - Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.
