#### **Announcements:**

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health announced that West Nile virus (WNV) was detected in mosquitos collected from Truro. Please see <u>this press release</u> from Health & Conservation Agent Emily Beebe for more information.

#### Practice Shark Safety:

- Don't swim where seals are present.
- Don't swim too far from shore.
- Swim in groups.
- Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to a shark).
- Avoid surfing alone.
- Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
- Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.

### This week's activities of note from the Town Manager's Office:

- Staff and I are preparing for an upcoming forum on storm preparedness. Please join us on Tuesday, September 10<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm for a "Community Conversation about Storm Preparedness." This event will feature information about how the Tow of Truro prepares and responds to storm events and how citizens can prepare themselves. There will be an opportunity for attendees to ask questions and offer suggestions.
- The closing on the Walsh property is delayed by the sellers but is still under contract. The Phase 1 Environmental Review was completed and no issues were reported.
- The Center for Costal Studies has started their research on sharks and their habitat. We will keep you posted as we learn more.
- The real time tagged shark tracking buoy has not been deployed at Head of the Meadow due to equipment issues.

#### **Department of Public Works**

- DPW Director Cabral met with the Woods Hole Group, Fuss & O'Neil, and the Department of Ecological
  restoration to review draft construction plans for the Eagle Neck Creek culvert project. Weekly progress
  meetings will take place leading up to the bid announcement. The Town is now moving steadily into the
  permitting phase, as well as contacting abutters.
- Phase two of the East Harbor Culvert repair is moving along into the local permitting phase. DPW
  Director Cabral and the Woods Hole Group will be filing to be heard at the October 9<sup>th</sup> Conservation
  Commission meeting.
- The Army Corps of Engineers will be submitting the final report on the Pamet River at the end of August.
- The DPW is preparing for the annual break down of beaches following the holiday weekend. Soon after
  the department will swing into catch basin cleaning and street sweeping to prepare for fall roadside
  brush cutting, and tree removal.

# Harbormaster/Shellfish Constable

- The harbor continues to have many transient and Rule #26 rental moorings this season.
- Revenue to-date for rental moorings is up 63% compared to 2018 total mooring rentals, however daily launches are down due to spotty Striped Bass fishing.
- A boat in the shallow mooring area came off its mooring one evening and floated into the salt marsh. Staff put an anchor out at low tide the following morning and put the boat back onto the mooring at high tide. There was no damage to the boat. Photos were sent to the owner and mooring holder and they were very appreciative to staff for getting the boat secured so quickly. (photos attached)
- People are continuing to obtain shellfish licenses and go clamming off Corn Hill to Great Hollow. Staff continues to monitor and patrol.
