Department News:

Fire Department

- The Department responded to 4 requests for medical assistance, resulting in 3 transports to the hospital. In all we responded to a total of 12 calls that included inspectional services, general assistance, alarm activations and calls for public service and good intent calls.
- The Department provided mutual aid to the Town of Wellfleet for a structure fire. Truro was responsible for water supply. There were no reported injuries but unfortunately there was extensive damage to the structure.
- The Select Board signed the contract for our new water tender, as approved at the 2018 Annual Town Meeting. This piece of apparatus replaces our existing 28-year-old tender and is anticipated to be in service before the summer season.
- Residents and visitors of Truro are encouraged to register for AlerTruro on Town's homepage (click on the triangle icon on the top right of the page to sign up). Users can select the types of messages they would like to receive from the Town. The system is used to send texts, calls and emails with public information broadcasts, severe weather alerts, beach information, road closures, etc.

Department of Public Works

- DPW crews will continue seasonal roadway brush cutting through the winter months to accommodate emergency vehicles. Woodchips from roadside clearing are available at the Transfer Station for any permitted resident for personal use only. All roadsides will be evaluated throughout the entire winter season targeting trees that are a hazard to Town infrastructure and power lines.
- The Transfer Station Swap Shop project is progressing. We hope to open May 1, 2019.
- DPW Director Cabral met with DOT officials for a pre-construction meeting regarding Route 6 bike lane

improvements.

- The annual Transfer Station solid waste and recycling report has been submitted to DEP. This automatically makes the Town eligible for future solid waste and recycling grants.
- The Transfer Station will be closed Monday February 18th for Presidents' Day.

Harbormaster/Shellfish Constable

- Barnstable County Dredge has completed the inlet part of the channel and will now move out into the approach.
- 25 people arrived on a bitter cold Sunday morning to harvest shellfish this week.
