Police Department

Investigation confirmed that this call was a hoax, and an Eversource representative verified that their customers are not asked for instant payments over the phone. - Snows Field house mold remediation has been completed. In addition, the basement ceiling will be insulated and painted with mold resistant paint.
- As part of the Green Community Grant award, the school heat pumps are scheduled for replacement next week. The pumps will be replaced one at a time so there will be no interruption with heat to the building.
- The Army Corps of Engineers is scheduled to meet with Town Administration to review the Pamet River data on January 31, 2019. A final report is expected to be delivered to the Town in March 2019.

Harbormaster/Shellfish Constable

- Harbor Master Jackett met with the Barnstable County Dredge Advisory Committee and was updated on the status of the dredge activity and learned the County dredge has embarked on its way to Provincetown before coming to Truro to dredge the approach and inner channel. Because of the Time of Year restriction of February 1st and the delay of finalizing the project change to our permit to dredge the basin, we are scheduled to do the basin June 1st using the 9 incursion days available to us and complete the job utilizing the funding made available to us that would otherwise expire on June 30th.
- Shellfish Constable Jackett took water samples throughout Pamet Harbor.
- There was much colder weather over the last week but a strong turnout of bundled-up, hearty, shellfish harvesters braved the chilly tide flats catching their limits.
