We hope this meeting will serve as an initial step in creating a local, state and federal partnership to address the complex issues that white sharks present to the Lower Cape.

- The Transfer Station Swap Shop project is progressing. We hope to have it open no later than May 1, 2019. The insulation has been installed and the sheetrock installation will be completed early next week.

 - Don't swim where seals are present.
 - Don't swim too far from shore.
 - Swim in groups.
 - Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to a shark).
 - Avoid surfing alone.
 - Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
 - Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.
