Announcements:

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health announced that Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE) was detected in mosquitos collected from Truro. Please see <u>this press release</u> from Health & Conservation Agent Emily Beebe for more information. Truro's risk level has been elevated to "moderate."

To reduce public exposure to mosquitoes carrying Eastern Equine Encephalitis and West Nile Virus, Truro has suspended issuance of beach fire permits at Town beaches until further notice.

Police Department

- Truro Police started their participation in No Shave November. Each officer who participates makes a contribution to Home Base for veterans and their families.

DPW

- The annual third-party inspection of the Transfer Station was completed and the report was submitted to DEP. No discrepancies regarding operational and regulatory functions were noted.
- As part of disaster preparedness, quarterly grading and brush cutting of dirt roads has been completed.
- DPW crews removed and replaced a damaged and undersized culvert located on Longnook Rd. Water flow in that area has improved. DPW Director Cabral met with DOT and Mosquito Control to review the culvert located under Route 6 which is connected to Longnook Road and we are waiting for their official assessment.
- Fall brush cutting of all town roads will begin in October, along with catch basin inventory and cleaning. As part of disaster preparedness, we will continue to take a more aggressive approach to brush cutting roadsides.
- As we head into the winter season, all culverts and waterways will be evaluated for any obstructions and sediment buildup. As done last year we will clean and jet culverts as needed.
