Announcements:

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health announced that Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE) was detected in mosquitos collected from Truro. Please see <u>this press release</u> from Health & Conservation Agent Emily Beebe and her report (below) for more information. Truro's risk level has been elevated to "moderate."

To reduce public exposure to mosquitoes carrying Eastern Equine Encephalitis and West Nile Virus, Truro has suspended issuance of beach fire permits at Town beaches until further notice.

Department News:

Department of Public Works

- The roadway paving bid opened on October 2, the bids are currently under review, we hope to have an award letter out next week.
- The annual third-party inspection of the Transfer Station is scheduled for next week. All operational and regulatory functions will be evaluated for compliance.
- The department continued this week inventorying and servicing equipment for the fall and winter season.
- The Building Maintenance Head Custodian has completed all annual routine building maintenance ranging from boiler services, fire suppression inspections, elevator state inspections, and all mechanical aspects of the HVAC system have also been serviced.
- Fall brush cutting of all Town roads will begin in October, along with catch basin inventory, and cleaning. As part of disaster preparedness, we will continue to take a more aggressive approach to brush cutting roadsides.
- As we head into the winter season all culverts and waterways will be evaluated for any obstructions, and sediment buildup. As done last year we will clean, and jet culverts as needed.

Harbormaster/Shellfish Constable

- Shellfish Constable Jackett finished broadcasting the final oyster spat in and around the harbor (this will help with future shellfish propagation).
- More than 50% of boats have hauled out for the season. Harbor Staff assisted people that needed help with trailers, sailboat masts, dinghies, etc.
- Staff will start hauling out vacant floats and place along rails so as not to obstruct boats and trailers that are still fishing for tuna.
- There has been an increase in daily launches, as well as charter boats and season launch holders, for people catching tuna mid-week. This increase has required staffing the harbor on late shifts.
- All waitlists have been updated; mooring holder fees paid; and final new mooring holders' assignment has been completed for 2019-2020.
