- Warning Recent shark sightings, practice shark safety.
 - Don't swim where seals are present.
 - Don't swim too far from shore.
 - Swim in groups.
 - Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to a shark).
 - Avoid surfing alone.
 - Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
 - Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.

Assessing Department

- Beginning July 1, 2019, the Assessors Office will begin accepting applications for the Residential and Statutory Exemptions for the Fiscal Year 2020.
- If you are already receiving the Residential Exemption, there is no need to reapply. The Assessors office will notify you if requirements are not met.
- All Statutory Exemptions (Senior, Veterans, Blind, etc.) must reapply annually, and applications will be mailed out next week to recent Statutory Exemption recipients.
- Applications received by August 15, 2019 will receive reductions on the October Tax Bill.
