
## This week's activities of note from the Town Manager's Office

## **Department News:**

## **Police Department**

- Truro Police Department was awarded a Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding grant through the Massachusetts EOPPS Office of Grants and Research (OGR). This funding can be utilized for personal protection equipment for agency members.
- Reminder for iPhone users who utilize the Emergency SOS feature on their phone the feature is easily triggered and has led to a number of accidental 911 calls Cape-wide. If you happen to inadvertently call 911, we ask that you stay on the line to explain what happened to the dispatcher since police must respond to confirm that there is no emergency. Thank you for your assistance.
- Truro is seeking applicants for the position of Part Time Telecommunicator. This is an on-call, as needed position. Applications can be obtained at the Truro Public Safety Facility or on our website: https://www.truro-ma.gov/truro-police-department

#### Fire Department

- The Department responded to 24 requests for medical assistance, resulting in 16 transports to the hospital. In all we responded to a total of 30 calls that included inspectional services, general assistance, alarm activations and calls for public service and good intent calls.
- The Fire Department was dispatched for a report of a bicycle accident at Old County and Mill Pond roads. The cyclist was transported to a Boston area Trauma Center via Boston Med flight for further evaluation and treatment of his injuries. The cyclist was not wearing a helmet.
- The Truro Fire Department provided mutual aid to the Town of Eastham for a fire in a garage. Truro provided a mutual aid ambulance and a command vehicle. There were no injuries but there was extensive damage to the garage.
- The Department would like to remind parents that motor vehicle accidents are the leading cause of
  death in child under 14 and a majority of those injured were not properly restrained. Truro Fire can
  check your car seat to make sure it is properly installed and appropriate size for your child. Below is a

## **Department of Public Works**

- The opening of the Swap Shop will be evaluated at COVID 19 Reopening Phase 4.

  - Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.

#### Assessing

• **Fiscal Year 2021** began on July 1, 2020. The Assessor's office is now accepting applications for the FY21 Residential and Statutory Exemptions. As a reminder the Residential Exemptions DOES NOT have to be renewed annually. We review information and will contact you if clarification is necessary. We accept applications for the Residential Exemption however the program is subject to renewal by an annual vote of the Select Board at the Classification Hearing usually held in September. For Statutory Exemptions (Seniors meeting strict Income and Asset guidelines, Disabled Veterans, and the Blind), we must receive an application annually and supporting documentation must be presented with the application. The Deadline for FY 21 is April 1, 2021 for exemptions however we advise you return ALL applications early so we can get the exemptions on the October tax bill. #### Library
