This week's activities of note from the Town Manager's Office:


- Truro now has five active cases of COVID-19 in Truro and ten resolved cases. Please remain vigilant. Wear a mask, wash your hands and practice social distancing.

Department News:

Department of Public Works

- The opening of the Swap Shop will be evaluated at Phase 4 of the Governor's Reopening Plan.
- To support the reopening of Truro Central School, the DPW has completed installing a plexiglass shield for the school offices and will be assisting with deep cleaning and sanitizing over the next few weeks. The DPW will continue to work closely with the school staff leading up to the new school year.
- The DPW will be sanitizing all buildings and the interior of vehicles, with a new fogger machine. The new machine researched and ordered by Fire Chief Collins. The DPW ordered three additional handheld foggers to be used daily by all custodians. The DPW custodial staff sanitizes and cleans facilities daily with an emphasis on high touch areas and individual offices. DPW staff will be installing toilet lids in all bathrooms, along with automatic flushers on urinals to limit incidents of Covid-19 transmission

- The DPW continues with standard summer season business; mowing, beach cleanup, street sweeping, monitoring waterways, and monitoring the Transfer Station activity.

Harbor Master/Shellfish Constable

- Harbor Master Jackett prepared for the tropical storm by securing mooring lines in the mooring fields.
- Several boat owners took precautions and hauled their boats out of the harbor before the tropical storm.
- Decent low tides allowed people access to shellfish areas off the bay beaches.
- There were reports of good fishing, along with great weather.

Recreation and Beach

- We would like to remind the public to continue to practice social distancing while visiting parks, trails, and beaches and wear a face covering when in public.
- The Truro Beach Office is open. The hours are 9:00 am 5:00 pm, with limited public access. We are asking the public to order their beach stickers online if they are able. Truro Resident & Non-Resident Beach Stickers can be purchased online by clicking <u>HERE</u>. For inquiries about the beaches, please call (508)487-6983.
- After reviewing guidance from the State of Massachusetts and the CDC, we have determined that we will not be able to safely operate the Summer Recreation Youth Program.
- Puma Park Playground is open. We remind the public to practice social distancing and wear a face mask in public. The playground is cleaned weekly.
- The Truro Community Center is closed but staff are still in the office. Staff can still be reached by phone (508) 487-1632, email <u>dclements@truro-ma.gov</u>, or via Facebook, and Twitter.
- Center for Coastal Studies has an informational tent at Head of the Meadow on Mondays from 10:00 am
 – 3:00 pm. The Center for Coastal Studies (CCS) is a non-profit organization dedicated to understanding,
 preserving, and protecting marine ecosystems and the coastal environment through applied research,
 education and public policy initiatives.
- Director Clements is working with Food 4 Kids to provide meals at the Community Center during the summer. The curbside distribution is conducted Monday-Friday from 10:00 am 12:00 pm. Staff from the Recreation, COA, and Library Departments are assisting with the distribution.
- Truro beach fire permits are currently suspended.
- Shark Warning Practice shark safety.
 - Don't swim where seals are present.
 - Don't swim too far from shore.
 - Swim in groups.
 - Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to a shark).
 - Avoid surfing alone.

- Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
- \circ Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.
- All programming/activities are suspended to stop the spread of the Coronavirus.
- COA continues participating in Lower Cape Outreach Council Food Pantry distribution now every other Friday through August. July 10th, July 24th, August 7th, and August 21st from 11-12:30pm. Food bag distribution 35-50 bags per week. COA staff is responding to emergency food needs throughout the week.

Assessing

• **Fiscal Year 2021** began on July 1, 2020. The Assessor's office is now accepting applications for the FY21 Residential and Statutory Exemptions. As a reminder, the Residential Exemption DOES NOT have to be renewed annually. We review information and will contact you if clarification is necessary. We accept applications for the Residential Exemption however the program is subject to renewal by an annual vote of the Select Board at the Classification Hearing usually held in September. For Statutory Exemptions (Seniors meeting strict income and Asset guidelines, Disabled Veterans, and the Blind), we must receive an application annually and supporting documentation must be presented with the application. The Deadline for FY21 is April 1, 2021 for exemptions however we advise you return ALL applications early so we can get the exemptions on the October Tax bill. <u>Library</u>

- Library statistics are in for the month of July. We supplied over 2,300 books to patrons through our curbside pickup service. In July 2019, we supplied almost 7,000 books for our patrons which means that in this metric, we are at 30% of our usual business. As I have heard, this figure is about the same as many businesses.
