Announcements:

Importantly, effective Friday Nov 6, all residents of Massachusetts are advised to stay home during the hours of 10pm and 5 am. Travel during this time may include going to work or school or for essential needs such as seeking emergency medical care, etc. Moreover, face coverings are required in all <u>public places</u>, whether indoors or outdoors (medical exemptions apply) for all persons over the age of 5 and recommended for ages 2-5. This week's activities of note from the Town Manager's Office

- Assistant Town Manager Clark and I virtually attended the Cape Managers'
 Meeting. There was discussion around a County-level effort to advocate for
 expanded broadband service or even a regional cable service, as well as, an
 appeal to State Officials for increased testing capacity for Covid on the Cape and Islands.
- The staff continues to process a significant number of public records requests. These requests require a significant amount of staff time for collecting, compiling, distributing and tracking the requests.
- We received word that the Barnstable County Dredge will arrive in the coming days to dredge the inlet and approach channel, weather permitting.
- Please note: The Oyster Shellfish Beds at the Pamet Harbor will be closed until further notice for retesting.

 Notice will be given for an opening date both at the Pamet Harbor and on the Town website.

Department News:

DPW

- The Transfer Station will be closed every Wednesday and Thursday, November 1, 2020 through April 30, 2021.
- The opening of the Swap Shop will be evaluated at COVID-19 Reopening Phase 4.
- As we head into the winter season, all culverts and waterways will be evaluated for any obstructions and sediment buildup. As done last year we will clean and jet culverts as needed.
- Resurfacing of the apparatus bay at the Public Safety Facility will continue for next week.
- The Beach Office exterior has been pressure washed and treated with a wood preservative. The first-floor interior has been emptied out to prepare for floor maintenance.
- Annual maintenance on the solid waste hoppers has been completed with no significant additional repairs required.



Health and Conservation

- Emails outlining the new masking requirements from Governor Bakers Emergency Order #55 ("revised order requiring facial coverings in public places") have been sent to all license/permit holders. We are also working on messaging this to the public using social media and targeting public locations with simple mask signage.
- Facial coverings are now <u>required</u> in all public spaces and establishments <u>regardless of physical</u> distancing.
 - This includes:
 - Public spaces indoors and outdoors;
 - public streets and ways;
 - o beaches;
 - o bike paths;
 - The order includes fining (up to \$300) for being un-masked in a public location.
- We have scheduled a second assuredness testing program for Monday 11-23-220 at the Truro Central School to test asymptomatic staff before the Holiday weekend. We will follow up with more testing in December. Our hope is to develop a surveillance testing program once a suitable product is available.
- The Truro and Wellfleet Elementary School flu clinics will be held on December 4 in Wellfleet from 2:30-4:30 in the Wellfleet Elementary School gymnasium, and in Truro on December 11 from 3:30-5:30 at the Truro Community Center. Participants from each school can attend either clinic and the clinics are open to students and their siblings and family members to satisfy the Massachusetts vaccination requirements, which now include seasonal influenza vaccination before the end of 2020.

- Shark Warning Great White Sharks are still active through early November. Practice shark safety.
 - Don't swim where seals are present.
 - Don't swim too far from shore.
 - Swim in groups.
 - Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to a shark).
 - Avoid surfing alone.
 - Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
 - Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.
- All programming/activities are suspended to stop the spread of the Coronavirus.

Library

- Some Outer Cape libraries are beginning to allow some limited access to the buildings. Truro Library is
 evaluating a possible limited re-opening after Thanksgiving.
- Full Steam Ahead Magnets Program for at-home learners will be held on Thursday, November 19th, at 3:00 p.m. Kits with all necessary supplies must be picked up at the library beforehand, so call the library to reserve your kit.
