

<u>Police</u>

- There has been an uptick in statewide fraudulent unemployment claims. The Department of
 Unemployment Assistance has reported that criminal enterprises have attempted to use stolen personal
 information from earlier national data breaches as part of a country-wide unemployment scheme. If you
 believe that a fraudulent unemployment claim has been filed on your behalf, please contact the Truro
 Police Department. Additionally, you can take the following steps to protect yourself against the effects
 of these types of claims:
 - o Change passwords on your email, banking, and other personal accounts.
 - Contact your credit card companies, banks, and other financial institutions to report the attempted fraud. You can also place alerts on your account.
 - Get a copy of your credit report and dispute any fraudulent transactions.
 - o Place a credit freeze with each of the three major credit reporting agencies.
 - o Contact the DUA customer service department at 877-626-6800.

• This week, we experienced widespread power outages in town. During these periods of lost power, our 911 emergency system was not impacted and remained fully operational.

DPW

- The opening of the Swap Shop will be evaluated at COVID 19 Reopening Phase 4.
- DPW Director Cabral prepared a status report of Truro's various environmental projects. Your can view it here.
- As the fall approaches, the DPW will begin to inventory and service all snow removal assets and review Department call-in procedures.
- We have scheduled the bell technician to adjust and test the bells along with the DPW at the end of October.
- The annual third-party inspection of the Transfer Station has been completed. Initial feedback from the inspector was that we have no discrepancies regarding operational and regulatory functions. We look forward to reviewing the formal report.
- Fall brush cutting of all Town roads will begin next week, along with catch basin inventory and cleaning.
 As part of disaster preparedness, we will continue to take a more aggressive approach to brush cutting roadsides.
- As we head into the winter season, all culverts and waterways will be evaluated for any obstructions and sediment buildup. As was done last year, we will clean and jet culverts as needed.
- Resurfacing the apparatus bay at the Safety Facility started this week. We anticipate the work taking up to four weeks.

Harbor Master/Shellfish Constable

- Shellfish Constable Jackett took water and shellfish samples with DMF for testing at State Lab prior to opening shellfish beds in early November.
- Harbor Master Jackett started taking out basin floats and storing them at the edges of the parking lot as some of the fleet has hauled out for the season. Removing the moorings in the tidal mooring field continues
- There have been fewer boats fishing as the weather has begun to shift toward more frequent windy days.

COVID - 19 Beach Safety Rules:

- Stay home if you feel sick.
- o Practice social distancing. Maintain at least 6 feet of distance between you and others.
- Practice beach distancing. Maintain at least 12 feet of distance from your nearest neighbor in any direction.
- Masks are required when 6 feet of distance cannot be maintained for ages 2 and up. Masks are not required to be worn while swimming or sunbathing.
- Puma Park Playground is open. We remind the public to practice social distancing and wear a face mask
 in public. The playground is cleaned weekly and hand sanitizing stations are present. Portable restrooms
 are no longer available.
- Shark Warning Great White Sharks are still active through October. Practice shark safety.
 - Don't swim where seals are present.
 - Don't swim too far from shore.
 - Swim in groups.
 - Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to a shark).
 - Avoid surfing alone.
 - Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
 - Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.
- Except as indicated, programming/activities are suspended to stop the spread of the Coronavirus.

Health Department

- On Thursday, October 15th, the Town and Truro Central School conducted our pilot sampling program to test asymptomatic Town and School staff members for SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19. The clinic went smoothly, and 44 volunteers participated. Results were emailed to participants about 36 hours after sampling was completed. The samples were analyzed at a lab affiliate of the Broad Institute in Cambridge. We achieved our goals with this pilot, which facilitated development of a relationship with the Cambridge Innovation Center; we are now an active client. Should we need to implement testing within the school or specific Town Departments, we can quickly and easily mobilize a sampling program.
 - As an informative aside: The sampling procedure used obtained a specimen from the front of the nose-this is an anterior narase specimen. This differs from the long swab sampling technique most people are familiar with-and squeamish about-and obtains a nasopharyngeal

specimen. In discussing the sampling with staff, several participated due to the type of specimen that would be collected and were much more comfortable with the idea of the short swab procedure. It is our hope that future work with CIC will include different sampling techniques, such as saliva, as well as surveillance testing.

- Our 2020 seasonal influenza vaccine clinic will be held on Thursday, October 29th. We have just changed the hours of the clinic, which will be held from 10 to 1 PM at the Truro Community Center. This will be a drive-thru clinic, for pre-registered citizens only. We are re-opening registration this week as an additional 100 doses, (including additional senior doses) have been made available. - We have set up <u>additional</u> influenza vaccine clinics in coordination with the Truro Central School, Wellfleet Health Department and the Wellfleet Elementary School. These 2 clinics will be for families and teachers and will be held on December 4th in Wellfleet in their gymnasium and in Truro on December 11th as a drive thru. Participants from each school can attend either clinic. The details on these clinics are still coming together, but pre-registration will be required.
- In September, the Town signed a contract with the Cape Cod Commission to conduct a watershed analysis of Standish/Pilgrim Pond. Part of this study will include an evaluation of the nutrient loading to the Pond. We will sample private wells in the watershed to determine the water quality. The development of a sampling strategy/sampling plan will be a part of this project and will be transferrable to other areas of town. The study will also focus on evaluating the stormwater inputs from Route 6. We are optimistic that this project will provide direction for future wastewater management in the area, as well as sound mitigation recommendations to address the health of the Pond.
