

Town of Truro Town Manager's Weekly Report



Department News:

<u>DPW</u>

- The opening of the Swap Shop will be evaluated at COVID 19 Reopening Phase 4.
- This week the DPW began breaking down the beaches by bringing in the shade structures, lifeguard stands and Mobi Mats. The Department will continue removing trash and recyclables through the end of September.
- The DPW continues with standard summer season business: mowing, beach cleanup, street sweeping, monitoring waterways, and maintaining the Transfer Station activity.
- DPW Director Cabral and Health Agent Beebe continue working with the Truro Central School to assist with school reopening.
- DPW personnel assisted the school this week by installing shade sail posts and hardware in support of
 developing the outdoor classroom areas. An additional plexiglass shield was custom built and installed
 in the nurse's office by building maintenance personnel to promote social distancing for staff and
 students. Next week, the Department will assist with spreading woodchips on the playground and
 adding additional posts for shade sails to be installed.

- The Town Hall bell tower was cleaned, tuned and tested and the lovers were reinstalled thanks to DPW building maintenance personnel Mike Locke, Alex Reis, Kyle Halvorsen, and our Chime Master Technician. The bells are back on and ring on the hour from 11:00am 7:00 pm.
- Preparations for Town Meeting set-up continued this week for all DPW personnel and included a final walkthrough with DPW Director Cabral, Town Manager Palmer, and Town Moderator Kraft and other town staff.

Harbor Master/Shellfish Constable

- Shellfish Constable Jackett has started putting out relay oyster stock into shellfish areas throughout Pamet Harbor which usually takes a few weeks. Water samples and quahog samples will go to the State to be tested at the State lab in preparation of opening the shellfish areas sometime after November 1st.
- Annual Shellfish licenses will go on sale October 12th. We sold 85 one-week licenses from June through September and averaged 25 people per week, mostly on weekends and more when we had big tides. Many people caught their limit, with the bulk of people shellfishing off Corn Hill Beach.

Health and Conservation

The 2020 Truro Flu Shot Clinic is scheduled for Thursday, October 29, 2020 from 10 am to noon. It will
be a drive thru clinic at the Truro Community Center for Truro residents, part-time residents and Town
of Truro staff. Please note that every person in the vehicle must be masked and pets are not permitted.

Recreation and Beach

- We would like to remind the public to continue to practice social distancing while visiting parks, trails, and beaches and wear a face covering when in public. For more information concerning COVID-19 click HERE

- The Truro Beach Office (36 Shore Rd) is closed and beaches are no longer protected by lifeguards.

COVID – 19 Beach Safety Rules:

- Stay home if you feel sick.
- o Practice social distancing. Maintain at least 6 feet of distance between you and others.
- Practice beach distancing. Maintain at least 12 feet of distance from your nearest neighbor in any direction.
- Masks are required when 6 feet of distance cannot be maintained for ages 2 and up. Masks are not required to be worn while swimming or sunbathing.
- **Puma Park Playground** is open. We remind the public to practice social distancing and wear a face mask in public. The playground is cleaned weekly and hand sanitizing stations are present.

• Beach Pet Closures

- Coast Guard Beach (Truro) CLOSED North and South of town access. NO PETS ANYTIME.

- Shark Warning Practice shark safety.
 - Don't swim where seals are present.

- Don't swim too far from shore.
- Swim in groups.
- Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to a shark).
- Avoid surfing alone.
- Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
- o Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.
- All programming/activities are suspended to stop the spread of the Coronavirus.

Assessing

- **Fiscal Year 2021** began on July 1, 2020. The Assessor's office is now accepting applications for the FY21 Residential and Statutory Exemptions.
- As a reminder the Residential Exemptions DOES NOT have to be renewed annually. We review
 information and will contact you if clarification is necessary.
- For Statutory Exemptions (Seniors meeting strict Income and Asset guidelines, Disabled Veterans, and the Blind), we must receive an application annually and supporting documentation must be presented with the application.
- Chapter 61A applications (Parcels totaling >5.0 acres- to be classified as farmland-meeting the requirements for established by the Department of Revenue) for Fiscal Year 2022 are due in the Assessor's office on or prior to October 1, 2020.
- The Deadline for FY21 is April 1, 2021 for exemptions, however we advise you return ALL applications early so we can get the exemptions on the October tax bill. Please feel free to contact the Assessor's Office with any questions at 508.349-7004 x 116 and we will be happy to assist.
