


#### **Police Department**

#### DPW

- The Transfer Station will be closed every Wednesday and Thursday, November 1, 2020 through April 30, 2021.
- The re-opening of the Swap Shop is currently under review with the Health Agent and DPW Director.
- DPW Director Cabral will be pursuing an MVP grant focused on Shore Road storm water runoff mitigation and paving. The Beach Point area, north towards Provincetown, is a priority area on Shore Road in terms of storm water mitigation.
