Town Manager's Weekly Report

July 2, 2021

Announcements:

- **Town Offices are closed July 5, 2021 in observance of Independence Day. The Transfer Station will remain open on July 4th and July 5th. Please have a safe and enjoyable holiday weekend.**
- **Town Offices Adding More In-Person Service Hours**
Town Hall is now open to the public Tuesdays through Fridays from 8 am to 4 pm. Town Hall will remain closed to the public on Mondays, but will continue to provide virtual, remote and online services. The Public Library offers browsing and other library services for the public from 12 pm to 6 pm on Tuesday and Thursday and from 10 am to 4 pm on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. Contactless pickup continues to be available.
The Community Center is open for in-person programming and appointments to the public Tuesdays through Fridays from 8 am to 4 pm but are available by phone and email on Mondays.
Masks are required in all public buildings until further notice.
Masks are no longer required outdoors on Town property.

This week's activities of note from the Town Manager's Office:

- The Annual Town Meeting was held on Saturday and 228 voters came out. Thank you to everyone who braved the warmer temperatures to come out. I wish to especially thank the staff for their hard work in the days, weeks and months leading up to the Town Meeting which helped to make the day run as smoothly as possible.
- The Planning Department received certification from the Department of Housing and Community Development that Truro is in compliance with its approved Housing Production Plan (HPP). The certification reflects Truro's achievement of the numerical housing production goal set in the HPP. Truro's Subsidized Housing Inventory is now at 5.87% up from 2.3%. This puts Truro closer to the 10% goal for Affordable housing identified in Massachusetts General Law Chapter 40B. Of course there is much more work to do to address housing needs in Truro, however, Truro should take a moment to recognize it's achievement of this milestone through permitting the Cloverleaf project.

Department News:

DPW

- **Reminder** Residents can check their Transfer Station license plate status on our Town website by viewing News & Announcements under the DPW/Transfer Station website and clicking "Transfer Station Access – License Plate lookup." Just enter your plate number and view your expiration date.
- The Transfer Station is open seven days a week from May 1, 2021 through October 31, 2021.
- The re-opening of the Swap Shop is tentatively scheduled for July 10, 2021. Swap Shop operating hours will be 8:00am – 2:00pm, Saturday through Monday. Swap shop will be open when volunteers are present during the operating hours. All volunteers must complete all required administrative taskings-online Ethics training, policy acknowledgements, and background check.
- The watermain has been installed through the Cloverleaf site and connected to the Fire House Road extension. After Labor Day we will begin to see roadway work on Highland for the final paving, erosion control, and drainage improvements.

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- East Harbor and Eagle Neck Creek have reached the bid announcement phase. The bid opening will take place on August 10, 2021. These projects have been combined into one project in hopes of lowering the overall project cost. Harbor Master/Shellfish Constable

- Harbor Master Jackett finished boating course and received certificate upon passing NASBL-approved test recognized by the Coast Guard.

- Made several calls requesting mooring holders to submit payment before June 30th. All have responded and came into the office to pay.

Recreation and Beach

- **Pet Closures** – Updated 6/29/21. QR Codes have been added to Pet Closure signs. This QR Code will direct individuals to the department web page with details pertaining to pet closures.

Truro beach rules and regulations state: All Animals Are Prohibited Between the Hours of 9:00 am And 6:00 pm, from the third Saturday in June through Labor Day. In addition, beach restrictions for pets may be increased due to the presence of shorebirds. Below is a detailed description of Truro Beach Pet Closures. If you have any questions as to whether or not pets are allowed, feel free to call (508)487-6983.

- Head of the Meadow Beach: NO PETS ALLOWED – Beach closed to pets traveling north and south of beach access path.
- Coast Guard Beach, Truro: NO PETS ALLOWED – Beach closed to pets traveling north and south of beach access path.
- Longnook Beach: Beach Closed to pets traveling approximately 1/8 mile north (left) of beach access path. Beach Closed to pets traveling approximately ¼ mile south (right) of beach access path.
- Ballston Beach: Beach Closed to pets approximately 1 mile south (right) of the beach access path. Beach Closed to pets traveling north (left) approximately ½ mile of beach access path.
- Bound Brook (Ryder Beach): Beach Closed to pets travelling to the south (left) of beach access path. Beach Closed to pets travelling to the north (right) approximately ½ mile of beach access path.
- Fisher Beach: Beach Closed to pets approximately ½ mile north (right) of beach access path.



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- Beach Point: NO PETS ALLOWED
- **SOLaware** – Director Clements continues to seek sponsors for UV Display Stations. For more information, click [HERE](#).
- **ORV** – Purchase of an O.R.V. Beach Sticker grants access to the O.R.V. Corridor on beaches owned by the Town of Truro ONLY. The Town of Truro can neither grant nor prohibit access to beach areas owned privately. Entry onto private land may subject O.R.V. drivers to a claim of trespass by the property owner(s).
- **Beach Clean-Up Bags**: Thanks to the efforts of Ellery Althaus this program concept has become a reality. Two Beach Clean-Up Bag stations have been installed by the DPW: one at Head of the Meadow Beach and one at Corn Hill Beach. As more stations are built, they will be installed. The goal is to have stations for all Town of Truro beaches.

Assessing

- Beginning July 1, 2021, the Assessor's Office will begin accepting applications for the Residential and Statutory Exemptions for the Fiscal Year 2022.
- If you are already receiving the Residential Exemption, there is no need to reapply. The Assessor's Office will notify you if requirements are not met.
- All Statutory Exemptions (Senior, Veterans, Blind, etc.) must reapply annually, and applications will be mailed out next week to recent Statutory Exemption recipients.
- Applications received by August 31, 2021 will receive reductions on the October Tax Bill.
