We are learning from the Joint P-town/Truro Water mtgs., that there are multiple concerns about overdevelopment and the effects this will have on the sole source aquifer. We playing with dangerously thin margins, especially in view of diminishing rain, rising temperatures.

My main concern is water but I'm sure that will be addressed.
