Department News:

Fire Department

- The Department responded to 6 requests for medical assistance, resulting in 4 transports to the hospital. In all we responded to a total of 24 calls that included inspectional services, general assistance, alarm activations, calls for public service assistance and a good intent calls.
- FF Sean Ferguson will be graduating from the Massachusetts Fire Academy in Stow this week after completing the 10 week career recruit program this Friday.
- Invitations to test for open positions have been sent to potential applicants. The process consists of both a written exam and oral interviews and we are hoping to have the process complete and new members on as soon as possible.
- The Department will be hosting a "stop the bleed" program. This program came out of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and is designed to teach people to recognize and administer care in a bleeding emergency where time can be a critical factor. The program is being delivered by Cape and Islands Emergency Medical services with Department members and the Truro lifeguards taking part. We hope to expand this program and make it available to interested parties.

Department of Public Works

- The Transfer Station is open 7 days a week. The Swap Shop will remain open three days a week (Saturday, Sunday and Monday) and closed Tuesday through Friday.
- The Transfer Station scale is now fully operational. All commercial entities are required to weigh solid waste and recyclables.
- Over the next couple of weeks, fresh parking paint markings will be applied for all beach locations and Town buildings.
- Solid waste for fiscal year 2018 through the month of May has dropped 135 tons when compared to the same time period of fiscal year 2017. Recycling has increased a total of 72 tons through May 2018 when compared to last fiscal year.
- Department of Transportation has responded to multiple DPW requests, and has completed jetting/cleaning the culvert located under Route 6 nearest to Longnook Road.

 Milling and paving of Arrowhead Road is tentatively scheduled for Tuesday and Wednesday of next week.

Harbor Master

- Two 16x18 foot dock sections (DMF Grant) are scheduled for installation at the end of existing docks by DPW staff starting on June 18th or June 19th per coordination with Harbor Master Jackett and DPW Director Cabral. The dock piling is scheduled for installation by Cape Cod Docks on June 20th. We will also be locating and putting in the mooring block and our Harbormaster/Emergency Float.
- The Harbor was busy over the weekend with charter fishing boats launching as well as other recreational fishermen and seasonal mooring holders putting boats on moorings and floats.
- Harbor Master Jackett is getting the summer schedule together with the assumption of a new Assistant Harbor Master hire in the next two weeks for training and the start of commercial bass season starting on June 25th.
- Shellfish Constable Jackett attended MSOA (shellfish meeting in Sandwich) to review southern New England Surf Clam investigation and also attended the Cape & Islands Harbor Master meeting in Waquoit Bay.
