The bathroom and overhead beam painting is scheduled to take place in two weeks.

Staff: Maggie will be going away for two weeks in early November. Peter and Ken have their reviews and step increases this month. Courtney is still working toward her master's degree in library science. This semester she is taking two classes.

CLAMS: Instead of having a nice quiet winter, I have found myself on two CLAMS committees, namely the Personnel Committee charged with replacing executive director Gayle Simundza, and the Legislative Breakfast Committee that will host an event that will inform elected representatives of the importance of libraries.

News: Poet Jon Loomis will be reading from his new book of poetry, *Mansion of Happiness*, on Tues., October 25, at 6:30 p.m.

Our Kids' Halloween party will be held on Sat., Oct. 29, from 10:00 a.m. to noon. Kids and staff will be in costumes.

Our debate-watching parties were successful. 68 people attended over the three nights.

Word of our Next Chapter Book Club, our book group for intellectually disabled adults, is spreading. Representatives from other Cape Cod libraries will be attending. Barbara Klipper will be busy instructing other Cape Cod libraries on how to start their own Next Chapter Book Club.

The Truro Central School has decided to limit their library visits to every other month. Maggie will be doing more in-school outreach to the kids. Barbara Klipper and Maggie are going to have a mock-Caldecott contest again this year.
