### JOINT MEETING WITH TRURO BOARD OF HEALTH

Board of Health Meeting Called to Order.

Chair Reed invited Board of Health Chair Tracey Rose to convene the meeting of the Board of Health. Chair Rose convened the meeting of the Board of Health at 5:10 pm and introduced present members: Vice-Chair Jason Silva and Member Helen Grimm.

## Presentation and Discussion on Stormwater Management and Regulations

Town Planner and Land Use Counsel Barbara Carboni introduced Water Resources Consultant Scott Horsley and Waer Resource Analyst for Cape Cod Commission Tim Pasakarnis. Consultant Horsley provided a Powerpoint presentation on stormwater management and regulations. His presentation reviewed effects of stormwater runoff pollutant, nitrogen and pathogen sources and their contribution to pollution, storm intensity in the northeast United States and how that impacts stormwater in our area, planning and zoning implications of stormwater management, and key mitigation measures. Questions were posed to Consultant Horsley regarding how to get the State and Federal governments to be involved in Truro's efforts, a question specific to Pond Village, and a question about the availability of grant funding.

Public Works Director Jarrod Cabral provided information on the current management of stormwater and catch basins and how major environmental projects in Truro take stormwater into consideration. Further comment regarding Department of Transportation's lack of responsiveness was made and discussed.

Vice-Chair Weinstein highlighted the MPO meetings and public hearings and invited the public to get involved to encourage stormwater mitigation efforts be considered during hearings.

His presentation highlighted the new departmental organizational structure and the ways this reorganization will benefit the community.
