There shall be a Selectmen liaison to the Committee and the Town Manager or his/her designee shall serve as staff liaison.

<u>ARTICLE 1</u>: AUTHORIZATION TO HEAR THE REPORTS OF MULTI-MEMBER BODIES

Move to hear reports of any multi-member body, whose annual report was not published in the 2017 Annual Town Report.

ARTICLE 2: AUTHORIZATION TO SET THE SALARY OF THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN

Move to set salary for the Board of Selectmen, as printed in the warrant.

ARTICLE 3: AUTHORIZATION TO SET THE SALARY OF THE MODERATOR

Move to set the salary for the Town Moderator as printed in the warrant.

ARTICLE 4: AMENDMENTS TO THE FY2018 OPERATING BUDGET

Move to appropriate from Free Cash the amounts listed in the warrant to supplement the operating budgets of the various Town departments for the current fiscal year.

ARTICLE 5: FY 2019 OMNIBUS BUDGET APPROPRIATION

Move to appropriate the sum of Nineteen Million, Four Hundred Eighteen thousand, Seven Hundred, Thirty-two dollars and no cents (\$19,418,732.00) to defray the expenses and charges of the Town of Truro in Fiscal Year 2019 (the period from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019), including the costs of public education, debt service and interest payments, and to meet said appropriation as printed in the warrant.

ARTICLE 6: TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM FREE CASH

Section One: To Reduce of Stabilize the FY 2019 Tax Rate

Move to transfer One Million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) from Free Cash to reduce or stabilize the 2019 Tax Rate.

Section Two: To the OPEB Trust Fund

Move to transfer the sum of Four Hundred Thousand dollars (\$400,000.00) from free cash to the Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) Trust Fund.

Section Three: To the Affordable Housing Trust Fund

Move to transfer the sum of Five Thousand Three Hundred dollars (\$5,300.00) from free cash to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund.

Section Four: To the Affordable Housing Trust Fund

Move to transfer the sum of Two Hundred Thousand dollars (\$200,000.00) from free cash to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund.

Section Five: To the Capital Expenditure Stabilization Fund

Move to transfer the sum of One Hundred Thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) from free cash to the Capital Expenditure Stabilization Fund.

Section Six: To the Stabilization Fund

Move to transfer the sum of One Hundred Thirty-five Thousand dollars (\$135,000.00) from free cash to the Stabilization Fund.

ARTICLE 7: COUNCIL ON AGING REVOLVING FUND

Move to set the spending limit for the COA Revolving Fund for Fiscal Year 2019 at Forty Thousand dollars (\$40,000.00).

ARTICLE 8: AUTHORIZATION TO EXPEND FUNDS IN ANTICIPATION OF REIMBURSEMENT FOR STATE HIGHWAY ASSISTANCE AID

Move to appropriate all sums provided to the Town pursuant to the Chapter 90 Highway Assistance Program of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation for purposes consistent with said program.

ARTICLE 9: CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM APPROPRIATION: CAPITAL EXCLUSION REQUEST(S)

Move to raise and appropriate the following described sums of money and to make each of these appropriations contingent upon so-called Proposition 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ capital outlay exclusion votes as allowed under the general provisions of MGL, Chapter 59, Section 21C (I $\frac{1}{2}$).

Section One: Replace Library Roof and Skylights

One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$150,000.00) to replace the roof and skylights at the Truro Public Library.

Section Two: Replace "Swap Shop"

One Hundred Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$100,000.00) to replace the "Swap Shop" at the Transfer Station and to address any remediation work required by the removal and replacement of the structure.

ARTICLE 10: BORROWING AUTHORIZATION FOR FIRE TENDER (Two-thirds vote)

That the Town appropriates Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000) to pay costs of acquiring a Fire Department Tender, and for the payment of all other costs incidental and related thereto; that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen is hereby authorized to borrow said amount under and pursuant to Chapter 44, Section 7(1) of the General Laws, or pursuant to any other enabling authority and to issue bonds or notes of the Town therefor; that the Town Manager is authorized to solicit bids, to enter into contracts and to expend this money for this purpose, and that Town Manager is authorized to seek, accept and expend any funds or grants which may be available to defray a portion of the cost of this acquisition. No amounts shall be borrowed or expended hereunder unless and until the Town shall have voted to exclude the raising of the amounts needed to repay any amounts borrowed pursuant to this vote from the limitations on local property taxes imposed by Chapter 59, Section 21C of the General Laws (Proposition 2½). Any premium received upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this vote, less any such premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this vote in accordance with Chapter 44, Section 20 of the General Laws, thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs by a like amount.

ARTICLE 11: COMMUNITY PRESERVATION ACT

Section One: Great Hollow Beach Extension

Move to appropriate the sum of One Hundred Ninety-two Thousand dollars (\$192,000.00) including One Hundred Sixty-two Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety dollars (\$162,890.00) from projected Fiscal Year 2019 Community Preservation Act Surcharge Revenue and Twenty-nine Thousand One Hundred and Ten dollars (\$29,110.00) from Community Preservation Act Undesignated Fund Balance to provide a grant to the Truro Conservation Trust for the purchase of a 1.09-acre lot at 2 Kill Devil Road (Assessor's Map 42, Lot 303) for the extension of Great Hollow Beach, subject to a grant agreement and a deed restriction.

Section Two: Edgewood Farm Historic Preservation Project Phase 3

Move to appropriate the sum of One Hundred Thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) including Forty-one Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety dollars (\$41,790.00) from Projected Fiscal Year 2019 Community Preservation Act Surcharge Revenue and Fifty-eight Thousand Two Hundred Ten dollars (\$58,210.00) from Community Preservation Act Undesignated Fund Balance for the restoration and preservation of three historic buildings at Edgewood Farm, subject to a grant agreement and a deed restriction.

Section Three: Preservation & Restoration of Highland House Museum Phase 3

Move to appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Sixty-two Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety-seven dollars (\$262,797.00) including One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand dollars (\$125,000.00) from Projected Community Preservation Act Surcharge Revenue, One Hundred Twenty-seven Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-five dollars and Fifty-four cents (\$127,755.54) from Community Preservation Act Undesignated Fund Balance and Ten Thousands Forty-one dollars and Forty-six cents (\$10,041.46) from the unexpended balance of the Truro Historical Society's project (as approved by Article 9, Section 1, Special Town Meeting November 14, 2006) for the third phase of the preservation and restoration of The Highland House Museum, subject to a grant agreement.

Section Four: Aerial Circus Rigging for Payomet Theater Circus Camp

Move to appropriate the sum of Seven Thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) from the Community Preservation Fund Undesignated Fund Balance for the purchase of aerial circus rigging for Payomet Theater Circus Camp, subject to a grant agreement.

Section Five: Replenishing the Truro Affordable Housing Trust Fund

Move to appropriate the sum of Fifty Thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) from Projected Community Preservation Act Surcharge Revenue, to replenish the Truro Affordable Housing Trust Fund.

Section Six: Truro Housing Authority Technical Assistance

Move to appropriate the sum of Thirty Thousand dollars (\$30,000.00), including Eight Thousand, Two Hundred Ten dollars (\$8,210.00) from Projected Community Preservation Act Surcharge Revenue and Twenty-one Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety dollars (\$21,790.00) from the Community Preservation Act Undesignated Fund Balance to permit the Truro Housing Authority to contract with a technical consultant on an occasional basis as needed for specific Affordable Housing projects.

Move to appropriate the sum of Twenty-nine Thousand One Hundred and Five dollars (\$29,105.00) from the Community Preservation Act Undesignated Fund Balance for the administrative expenses of the Community Preservation Committee.

ARTICLE 12: ACCEPTANCE OF MGL CHAPTER 59, SECTION 57A FOR REAL ESTATE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY COLLECTION

THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF TRURO TO CONVEY A PERPETUAL TRAIL EASEMENT ON CONSERVATION LAND TO TRURO CONSERVATION TRUST.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the town of Truro, acting by and through its board of selectmen, may convey to the Truro Conservation Trust, a Massachusetts charitable trust, a perpetual trail easement over a portion of a certain parcel of conservation land identified in section 2, extending from state highway route 6 in the town of Truro through the parcel to adjacent land owned by the Truro Conservation Trust and identified in section 3.

SECTION 2. The parcel subject to the easement authorized in section 1 is located at 139 state highway route 6, shown as lot 5 on a plan recorded in the Barnstable county registry of deeds in plan book 569, page 44 and described in a deed recorded in the Barnstable county registry of deeds in book 14745, page 101 and was acquired by the town of Truro for the purposes of chapter 293 of the acts of 1998.

SECTION 3. The parcel of land owned by the Truro Conservation Trust and benefiting from the easement authorized in section 1 is described in a deed recorded in the Barnstable county registry of deeds in book 29489, page 328 and shown as lot 4 on the plan referenced in section 2.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.




EXHIBIT C Sketch of Easement Area and Existing Path

Members Present: Chair Paul Wisotzky; Maureen Burgess, Jay Coburn, Robert Weinstein, Janet Worthington Present: Town Manager Rae Ann Palmer; Assistant Town Manager Kelly Sullivan-Clark; Town Accountant Trudi Brazil

Chair Paul Wisotzky called the meeting to order and at 6:00 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENT

High Dune Craft Cultivation Cooperative members Tim McCarthy and Drake Cook each spoke against placing a moratorium on cannabis businesses in Truro. Jack Riemer discussed the Planning Board's efforts with Town Counsel to develop bylaws that serve the entire town. He said he did not favor an amendment to the moratorium article. Rachael Sokolowski asked that the Selectmen consider the craft farmers in their decision on a moratorium.

STORM IMPACTS AND RESTORATION

Town Manager Rae Ann Palmer invited staff to discuss response after the winter storms to electrical outages, clearing the roads, beach erosion and the impact along the Pamet River. Health & Conservation Agent Emily Beebe said that the Army Corps of Engineers and the Park Service had provided data that assisted the Town's study of the flood plain on the upper Pamet River and at Ballston Beach. DPW Director Jarrod Cabral explained preparations and follow-up brush cutting, sand removal, and drain cleaning. He said that Barnstable County geologists believe the Longnook Beach dune will settle into a stable slope by itself. There was a drone inspection over the Pamet River done, he said. DPW has replenished sand at Coast Guard Beach and will be replanting beach grass. More parking lot will be removed at Ballston Beach, but homeowners will still be able to access their property, and the beach path will remain. Approximately thirty-one or thirty-two spaces are left in the Ballston Beach parking lot. Emergency Management Leader and Fire Chief Timothy Collins explained efforts to protect the citizens, communicate with Eversource for power restoration, and the team work involved during the storms.

Selectmen added their thoughts on emergency preparedness. Jay Coburn discussed private electrical poles in the National Seashore. Paul Wisotzky addressed the problem of Internet and cell phone outages. Janet Worthington said the community as a whole needs to be prepared for a bigger event. Robert Weinstein commented on our vulnerability with dependence on computer networks. He mentioned how Eversource crews couldn't work until the wind had subsided. He discussed the need for better town mapping to help Eversource. He recommended working on local remedies. Maureen Burgess asked about intra-Town communications. Ms. Palmer said their Verizon cell phones worked, 9-1-1 always works, but the Town Hall Comcast system reverts to the fax machine.

NEW MEMBERS TO POLICE FORCE

Interim Police Chief Craig Danziger introduced the three new members of the Truro Police Force: John Medeiros, Andrew Starbard and Sarah Lake. He detailed the backgrounds and talents for each officer and commended the energy and willingness to work they bring to the department. Jay Coburn expressed special thanks to the Police Department.

SELECTMEN ACTION

Warrant Article Recommendations

Jay Coburn pointed out that the Board recommends placement of the Town Meeting Warrant Articles, but it is the voters who make the decisions on the Articles at Town Meeting. Ms. Palmer asked that the Article 21 be taken first in order to hold a telephone conference with Town Counsel, who had advised against an amended version which removed craft cultivators from the moratorium. During the phone conference, Town Counsel explained that she recommended the total moratorium since new cannabis control regulations had just been issued; craft cultivators can hold up to three manufacturing/processing licenses; the Attorney General had considered craft cultivator cooperatives a new use; a moratorium would give time to study and regulate the use; and the state licensing process had been slowed down so the cultivators would not be delayed that many more months by a moratorium until December 31. The moratorium would allow the Town to get zoning bylaws into place. Exempting craft cultivators would be giving them preferential treatment and grandfathering them if they were allowed before the zoning bylaws were approved.

Town Counsel responded to questions from the Board on grandfathering, by which the applicants would be governed by existing bylaws; the 100,000 square feet allowed for an LLC cooperative business; fees determined by space; operating across municipal lines; and the risk factor of a zoning bylaw being overturned by the Attorney General. Jay Coburn suggested moving the moratorium date to November 15 with a Fall Town Meeting vote on cannabis business zoning bylaws.

Article 21 - Amend Zoning Bylaws §40.8 Establishing Moratorium on Recreational &Medical Marijuana Establishments

Keeping in mind Town Counsel's advice that it would be to the advantage of the Town to get the zoning in place, members of the Board of Selectmen considered Article 21 to establish a moratorium on recreational and medical marijuana establishments. Most of the Board said they now did not favor exempting the craft cultivators from the moratorium although they are sympathetic to the agricultural community. Chair Paul Wisotzky said he was impressed and inspired by their organization and participation in the process. Selectmen said a moratorium shortened to November 15 was possible.

Jay Coburn moved to recommend Article 21 with the amendment that the moratorium be in place till November 15, 2018 and that the language exempting craft cultivators be removed.

He withdrew the motion in order to make the amendment separately.

Jay Coburn moved to amend Article 21 by removing the language exempting craft cultivators from the moratorium and by shortening the moratorium until November 15, 2018. Maureen Burgess seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Jay Coburn moved to recommend Article 21 as amended and place the Article on the Town Meeting Warrant. Robert Weinstein seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Rae Ann Palmer promised that she would work with the craft cultivators and get the bylaws in place.

Article 4 - Operating Budget

There were amendments for transfers from Free Cash totaling \$215,000, including \$45,000 for snow removal; an additional \$100,000 for the Pamet River Study account; \$55,000 for the failed Beach Office septic system; and \$15,000 for an IT program for the DPW.

At Robert Weinstein's request, Town Accountant Trudi Brazil provided an expansive definition of "Free Cash." Free cash is made up of appropriated funds in a prior year that are not expended or encumbered after that year closes. They are also made up of excesses in estimated receipts like building permits, motor vehicle excise, hotel/motel room tax. "Free cash" is neither *free* nor *cash*. It is an equation of things not built into our tax rate, which is estimated, in order to balance what we want to spend with the money we have available from taxation. If it balances well, there is a surplus that is certified by the state to be used to offset spending for the next year.

Jay Coburn moved to recommend Article 4. Robert Weinstein seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Article 5 – Omnibus Budget of \$19,418,732

Jay Coburn moved to recommend Article 5. Janet Worthington seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Article 6, Section 6 – Transfer from Free Cash to General Stabilization Fund

Robert Weinstein moved to recommend Article 6, Section 6. Maureen Burgess seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Article 10 – Borrowing for Fire Tender

Rae Ann Palmer explained that Bond Counsel had prepared the Article and the need. Jay Coburn moved to recommend Article 10. Robert Weinstein seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Article 11 is comprised of six sections for Community Preservation Act funding requests.

Article 11, Section 1 - Phase 3 Great Hollow Beach Extension

The Article 11, Section 1 was amended to ensure public use, Rae Ann Palmer said. Money would not be released until the covenants and deed restriction issues in the neighborhood were resolved. Jay Coburn spoke against the proposal because it was not money going to Community Housing. Janet Worthington said that attention to beaches and open space is not in conflict with

housing needs. Maureen Burgess expressed interest in obtaining the additional beach and did not want to lose the opportunity. Paul Wisotzky asked about provisions for handicap access.

Community Preservation Committee Co-Chair Mary Rose and CPC member Rex McKinsey explained choices that CPC had made regarding a Community Housing application for a project in Eastham. Robert Weinstein invited Assistant Town Manager Kelly Clark, the former Beach Director, to address historic use of Great Hollow Beach. Ms. Clark said there is no beach attendant there because the lot is rarely filled. Maureen Burgess mentioned Great Hollow as a sunset viewing spot. Janet Worthington speculated how a a big house and more restrictions could become the future for the location. Jay Coburn reiterated his opposition to using CPA funds for the effort.

Janet Worthington moved to recommend Article 11, Section 1. Robert Weinstein seconded, and the motion carried 3-1-1.

Article 11, Section 2 - Edgewood Farm Historic Preservation Project Phase 3 Paul Wisotzky disclosed that he teaches at Castle Hill.

Rae Ann Palmer explained the historic preservation deed restriction required for the project. Robert Weinstein objected to the historic preservation restriction, preferring that use could be controlled. Mary Rose and Rex McKinsey explained Castle Hill Center for the Arts' year-round

offerings at the Edgewood Farm location. Maureen Burgess moved to recommend Article 11, Section 2. Janet Worthington seconded, and the motion carried 2-2-1.

Article 11, Section 3- Highland House Museum Phase 3

Robert Weinstein asked about the lease with the Seashore, a twenty-year agreement that has been executed. Rae Ann Palmer reminded everyone that artifacts housed in the museum belong to the Town of Truro. So far \$417,000 of CPA funds have been granted to the Highland House historic restoration project.

Robert Weinstein moved to recommend Article 11, Section 3. Janet Worthington seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Article 11, Section 4 - Aerial Circus Rigging

Robert Weinstein moved to recommend Article 11, Section 4 for \$7,000 to Payomet Theater for aerial circus rigging. Jay Coburn seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Article 11, Section 5 - Replenishing the Affordable Housing Trust Fund

Robert Weinstein moved to recommend Article 11, Section 5 - Replenishing the Truro Housing Trust Fund for \$50,000. Maureen Burgess seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Article 11, Section 6 - Truro Housing Authority Technical Assistance

Maureen Burgess moved to recommend Article 11, Section 6 for technical assistance for the Truro Housing Authority for \$30,000. Robert Weinstein seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Article 11, Section 7 - Administrative Support

Maureen Burgess moved to recommend Article 11, Section 7. Robert Weinstein seconded, and the motion carried 5-0-0.

Other Warrant Articles

Rae Ann Palmer said there will be an amendment to the Petitioned Article which will be done at Annual Town Meeting. Paul Wisotzky recommended including the explanations for the Customary Articles in the Annual Town Meeting Warrant.

Message from the Board of Selectmen

Robert Weinstein noted with thanks an edit to the "Message from the Board of Selectmen" in the Warrant. The Board was satisfied with the entire message.

Town Meeting Preparation

Jay Coburn requested posting a meeting immediately prior to Town Meeting.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Town Manager Rae Ann Palmer explained the claims analysis that had been done with a recommendation to shop for the best insurance deal.

Robert Weinstein moved to authorize the Massachusetts Interlocal Insurance Association (MIIA) to provide a quote for group health insurance coverage to the Town of Truro. Maureen Burgess seconded, and the motion carried 5-0.
