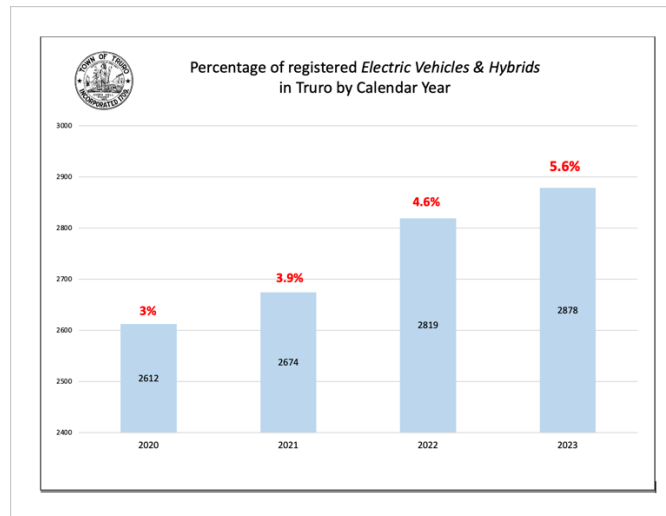


Climate Action Committee – for May newsletter. (DRAFT)
