Truro Housing Authority Minutes: January 11, 2024 at 5:00 pm -- Hybrid Meeting at Truro Library

Committee Members attending: Kevin Grunwald, Chair; Betty Gallo, Melissa Wheeler and Mara Glatzel, members. Member Paul Wisotzky attended remotely.

Also attending: Town Organizer/Truro Media and Anne Greenbaum, Vice Chair of Planning Board.

I. Roll Call

II. Vote to Approve Minutes from Nov 9, 2023. Betty Gallo moved to approve the minutes. Mara Glatzel seconded the motion. Paul Wisotzky noted that he was not present at the November meeting. Minutes were approved unanimously by a roll call vote.

III. Public Comment.

- Ella Sampou, community organizer with the CDP, came to share best practices for creating public forums in advance of our discussion on the agenda. Her suggestions included beginning with desired outcomes, varying the ways that information goes out after determining who you hope to have in the room, and ensuring that comprehension is at a high school level.
- Anne Greenbaum shared an update that the planning board is trying to work up an
 article for the ATM that will allow us to create affordable housing on undersized lots. The
 planning board is hoping to work with the housing authority to co-sponsor the article.

IV. Proposed THA Community Forum. Presented by Kevin Grunwald. Kevin proposed a public forum to answer questions about 40B where the Truro community can

get together for a formal presentation and Q&A.

Committee discussion about perhaps changing and expanding this concept into more of a speaker series, where we focus on a few topics, bring in experts from outside of town, and answer frequently asked housing questions, such as what is the process to get into affordable housing, how are affordable housing financed, who qualifies for affordable housing, etc.

Mara suggested that we record the series and put the recordings up on the town website for people to watch who aren't able to join live.

Committee discussed how to reach facets of the Truro population who might not often engage with this type of event.

Anne Greenbaum shared that she loves the idea of community ed/community engagement, but didn't agree that 40B was the right starting point, a sentiment echoed by Paul Wisotzky who was

hopeful that we would be able to facilitate information sessions that lead to informed decision making about what is on the table right now for STM and ATM this spring.

Proposed topics included:

- Housing 101 (Terms, tracks for how people get into housing)
- A guide to 40B
- A personal look at how people travel through the affordable housing process
- Affordable housing financing

Additionally, the committee discussed:

- - Partnering with the library or Friends of the Meetinghouse for the series
- Creating opportunities shared understandings
- Making sure meetings had snacks, Coffee etc.
- - Developing a planning committee

For next meeting: Identify list of topics, potential speakers, local partners, potential dates

V. Discussion of the Draft Regional Housing Strategy. Presented by Kevin Grunwald.

Committee looked through the Cape Cod Commission's Draft Regional Housing Strategy and discussed how the ideas might be furthered in our work in Truro, including the creation of a Truro zoning task force, as the ad hoc housing committee dissolves.

CCC is looking for feedback on the document during the public comment period.

Mara to be in touch with Ellery and Anne of the planning board to work on a draft article on undersized lots for ATM and bring work to the next meeting.

VI. Discussion of a Campaign to Implement 2022 Town Warrant, Article 34, Establishing A Municipal Affordable Housing Trust Fund. Presented by Kevin Grunwald.

Committee discussed their desire to work towards finalizing the modernization of the Municipal Affordable Housing Trust Fund.

Kevin to talk to Barbara, Daren, and Kristen to see if this is something they are interested in pursuing in 2024.

Trudy Brazil is working on the flowchart about the different affordable housing sources and the amount of funding available in the different accounts.

VII. Development of a List of Properties in Truro on Which Affordable Housing Units May be Sited. Presented by Kevin Grunwald.

Town is currently working on looking at public and privately owned properties that might be possible. John Nahas is developing a database.

VIII. CPC Update. Presented by Betty Gallo.

Committee discussion about our application for CPC money for housing. CPC doesn't have any questions for the committee at this time.

IX. Housing Coordinator. Presented by Kevin Grunwald.

Kevin is continuing to work on this and will keep us posted on developments at the next meeting.
