The penalty for voting or attempting to vote in violation of the absentee voting laws is a fine of not more than ten thousand dollars and imprisonment for not more than five years.

IMPORTANT - DO NOT MARK YOUR BALLOT UNTIL YOU HAVE READ INSTRUCTIONS COMPLETELY!

## BEFORE YOU VOTE:

Make sure you are eligible. You may vote absentee only if you will be unable to vote at the polls on election day because of:

- absence from your city or town during the hours polls are open
- physical disability
- religious beliefs

Arrange for any assistance you may require. If you cannot mark your own ballot because you are physically disabled, unable to write, or unable to read, or to read English, you may choose any person to mark your ballot for you.
VOTING INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALL VOTERS

1. Mark your ballot while alone unless you need assistance in reading or marking your ballot and have requested help.
2. Fold your completed ballot and seal it in the smallest ballot envelope. This envelope has an affidavit printed on the front of it.
3. Sign and swear to the affidavit. Be sure you sign your name as you are registered. (The ballot was mailed to you in your registered name.)
4. If you were unable to mark the ballot yourself, the person assisting must state that you needed assistance, and the reason, on the affidavit and must also sign your name on the envelope.
5. Put the completed ballot envelope in the large mailing envelope which is already addressed to your city or town clerk or election commissioner. Unless you are NOW voting at your clerk's office, you can MAIL your ballot to your city or town clerk, or it can be delivered in person by a family member who is either a spouse or person residing in the same household, in-laws, father, mother, sister or brother of the whole or half blood, son, daughter, adopting parent or adopted child, stepparent or stepchild, uncle, aunt, niece, nephew, grandparent or grandchild, or unless you are voting at a designated health care facility, or you have entered a hospital within five days before the election. To have your ballot counted, mail or deliver it in time to reach your local election officials before the polls close on election day.

## TO VOTE IN PERSON AT THE POLLS

If you have applied for this absentee ballot but later find that you are able to and want to vote in person at the polls, you must obtain a certificate giving you the authority to do so from your city or town clerk or election commissioner. You cannot obtain this certificate once your absentee ballot has been processed.
