Department News:

Police Department

- Our Part-Time Telecommunicators have been registered to attend APCO EMD class this September.
- All Full-Time Telecommunicators completed a CPR Course and received CPR cards.
- All Full-Time Telecommunicators and Patrol Certified Telecommunicators have been recertified in APCO EMD dispatch. The certification is good for two years.

Fire Department

- The Department responded to 26 requests for medical assistance, resulting in 4 transports to the hospital. In all we responded to a total of 31 calls that included inspectional services, general assistance, alarm activations and calls for public service assistance and a good intent calls.
- The Fire Department responded to a motor vehicle accident near the intersection of Rt. 6 and Castle Road. There was significant damage to the cars involved but no individuals were transported from the scene.

Department of Public Works

- Due to severe washouts on Town Center Road, construction to add an additional waterway and catch basin began this week and will be completed next week.
- Capital improvement projects have begun for the new fiscal year. Gutter replacement at the Public Safety Facility has been completed, along with window flashing repair and water proofing around window trim. A water pressure test was also completed to ensure no future leaks. The Library received a new door at the main entryway, along with new controls. Key fob system expansion is scheduled to begin the first week of August. The expansion includes the Town Library, Safety Facility, and Town Hall.
- New doors are being built for the sheds located at Head of the Meadow Beach and Snows Field to accommodate seasonal storage for the new Recreation and Beach ATV.
- Roadway sweeping and mowing continue, along with standard landscape maintenance along town roads and grounds. Frequency of catch basin cleaning has increased due to the amount of rain we have received this spring.
