This week's activities of note:

- Town Manager Palmer, Clerk/Treasurer/Collector Slade and I met with Town of Provincetown staff to discuss employee health insurance and to explore potential ways to mitigate rising costs and plan design changes.
- I attended a training in Boston on ADA compliance for municipalities which satisfied one of the FY17 Community Development Block Grant application requirements. Part of the training included information about upcoming technical assistance grants that will be offered by the Massachusetts Office on Disability to update State-mandated Self-Evaluation and Transition Plans.
- White shark activity continued this week. Head of the Meadow was closed for approximately two hours on Thursday due to activity from a shark tagging boat and shark spotter plan.

Department News:

Police Department

- The Department continues to conduct pro-active traffic enforcement on primary and secondary roads.
- The Department continues to place the speed trailer at various locations in town.
- Two Department Motor Officers, who are members of the Cape Cod Regional Law Enforcement Council Motorcycle Unit, provided assistance at the Big Nick's Ride for the Fallen, held on Sunday, July 23, 2017.
 The event is held in honor of Cape Cod's Fallen Military Men and Women.

Fire Department

- The Department responded to 9 requests for medical assistance, resulting in 7 transports to the hospital. In all we responded to a total of 23 calls that included inspectional services, general assistance, alarm activations and calls for public service assistance and a good intent calls.
- The Fire Department responded to the Top Mast hotel for a report of smoke in the building. Arriving company found a light smoke condition. Investigation revealed the smoke was the result of a hot water heater malfunction that had started to ignite the floor. This was extinguished with minimal water and there was no estimate on damage.

Department of Public Works

- In collaboration with the National Seashore, a large concrete block was removed early Monday morning from the beach access pathway at Longnook Beach. DPW personnel were also dispatched to the Noon's Heights area to provide a burial for a deceased basking shark.
- The culvert on Castle Road that is connected to Little Pamet has been cleaned out along with the culvert located on the seaward side of Little Pamet. The clapper valve is functioning on the outermost seaward side and water is flowing.
- License plate recognition technology at the Transfer Station continues to improve. The DPW has activated two smart phones which are carried by staff members, which enables the attendants to monitor and validate plates while assisting clients outside of the office.

Harbor Master
