Matrix Consulting was hired with funds from a Community Compact grant from the Commonwealth to do an assessment of opportunities for Truro and Provincetown to share services. There will be a presentation of the project at an upcoming Board of Selectmen meeting and there will be community meetings, staff and elected official meetings, in both Towns, as well as a community survey.
- Staff and I met with Costal Engineering to kick off the permitting process for expansion of the Town's dinghy dock at Pamet Harbor. The Town has received a grant for the work, once the permitting and engineering design is completed.
- Staff and I met with members of the Chamber of Commerce for planning for Truro Treasures. The event will be planned and run by the Chamber and we are looking to partner on the weekend's activities to create a cohesive community event.

Department News:

Police Department

- Student Officers Sarah Lake and Andrew Starbard have completed their 9th week at the Plymouth Police Academy. Both are doing very well.
- Part Time Telecommunicators Selina Austin, Jade Huber, and Leah Pelkey, continue to train towards working solo dispatch shifts.
- Administrative Assistant Jackie Mastrianna and Chief Danziger attended training held at the Yarmouth Police Department on Tuesday, August 8th. The training covered legal issues surrounding the denials & revocations of LTC's (license to carry firearms).

Fire Department

- The Department responded to 10 requests for medical assistance, resulting in 9 transports to the hospital. In all we responded to a total of 27 calls that included inspectional services, general assistance, alarm activations and calls for public service assistance and a good intent calls.
- The Fire Department responded to Provincetown to assist the Barnstable County Dive Team with a search operation in an attempt to locate a missing diver. Car 471 and the Marine unit were dispatched to Coast Guard Station Provincetown which was the location of the search command center.

Department of Public Works

- Beginning November 1, 2017 the new Swap Shop hours will be Saturday through Monday 7:00am 3:00pm, closed Tuesday through Thursday. Also beginning November 1, 2017 The Transfer Station will no longer accept cash payments. The Transfer Station will continue to accept check and credit card payments.
- The small single stream recycling compactor that resides next to the solid waste compactor has been removed to accommodate the installation of the new large single stream compactor. The installation will begin the week of the 21st of August.
- The DPW has scheduled the Truax Corporation for Monday the 14th of August to examine the integrity of the 500' long culvert located at Little Pamet on Corn Hill Rd. This will include jetting (cleaning) the

interior of the culvert, and recording video.

- Roadway sweeping, and mowing continue, along with standard landscape maintenance along Town roads, and grounds. Frequency of catch basin cleaning has increased due to the amount of rain we have received this spring.
- Online Sales for the Transfer Station permits continue with daily sales through Personal computers and kiosk locations.

- Harbor Master Jackett assigned transient moorings as the mooring field is nearing capacity.
- Harbor Master Jackett retrieved dingy from the marsh and checked lines to make sure dingys were secure.
