# Fire Department

- The Department responded to 5 requests for medical assistance, resulting in 4 transports to the
  hospital. In all we responded to a total of 10 calls that included inspectional services, general assistance,
  alarm activations, calls for public service assistance and a good intent calls.
- The Fire Chief met with area Chiefs and the Director of the Barnstable Fire Academy to finalize the agenda for the regional training day. The day will be two separate tracks. One is focused on the Incident Command System (ICS) and the other program is a Basic Skills Refresher.
- Fire Fighter Christianna Brown has started her 10 week Career Recruit program and Fire Fighter Laytin Reis is halfway through his program and scheduled to graduate on 3 November 2017.
- The Department welcomes the addition of 2 new per-diem staff members to the roster. Fire Fighter/EMT's Benjamin Bartolini and Joseph Battista have come on board to help supplement Department operations.

### **Harbormaster**

- Last week the Harbor Staff made parking available for a bus of a visiting high school girls' soccer team. A local stand-up paddle board company made boards, paddles, and wetsuits available for use for the team to paddle up the harbor river (see attached photo 201709323).
- With continued good weather and no wind, tuna fishing activity this week has increased and we are seeing more vehicle/trailer launches with the parking lot about ½ -3/4 full mid-week and almost completely full on weekends. Therefore we have put out a half dozen cones to make sure mooring holders that are still in the water have ample parking.
- Because the end of the summer boat season is approaching, many mooring holders and float owners have hauled out their boats for the season. The harbor staff aided several boat owners with safe hauling of boats as well as putting a couple of stranded boats on trailers with the Harbormaster boat. There are only about 1/3 of the total boats that are still on moorings and floats so planning for removal of floats and moorings is underway for the next couple of months in preparation for annual dredging.
- The Harbormaster met with Coastal Engineering (the company the Town is using to facilitate sediment sampling and the permitting process) to update the status and plans for dredging the harbor channel, dock and basin mooring area. The staff also reviewed the status of the permitting process for the new dock expansion with Coastal Engineering and referred them to the Truro Conservation Department for further documentation required.
- During the week, a lot of work was accomplished by the Shellfish Warden by putting out the remaining bags of remote set oysters. Several boatloads of bagged remote set oyster in areas of the harbor that were previously surveyed will need additional propagation and seeding (see photo 20170928).
