Department News:

Department of Public Works

- The retaining wall at the Transfer Station has been backfilled and catch basins have been installed above and below the wall to address water drainage. In addition, a ramp to the single stream compactor has been completed and is ready for use. A boulder retaining wall is being installed along the hill side, and will be completed next week. It is important to note that all work associated with the Transfer Station has been accomplished by DPW staff with the exception of the concrete retaining wall and associated engineering. The Transfer Station Scale bid opening was last week and the award letter and contract are currently under review.
- Due to heavy rain, street sweeping and clearing of water ways continued this week throughout Town.
- Online sales for the Transfer Station permits continue with daily sales through personal computers, kiosk locations, as well as over the counter sales at Town Hall.
- The Beach Office septic system bid announcement opening will be held Friday. Our hope is to schedule an install date with the winning bidder for mid May 2018.
- East Harbor kick-off meeting activities are scheduled for the 20th of November with the Woods Hole Group.

Harbormaster

- Both the water samples and shellfish samples tested clean and the notice to open shellfish areas November 5th has been posted.
- The Harbor Master is nearing the completion of removing the moorings in the tidal basin and the floats in the basin mooring field.
- Fierce winds and heavy rains occurred for the second week in a row. The Harbor Master secured the toilets and the bailing out of dinghies as well as keeping a sharp eye on the harbor.
- We were fortunate to have exceptional weather on weekends during October and many out of State fishing boats launched out of Pamet as well as our local fishing fleet. It also was an ideal time for boaters planning to haul their boats out for the season.

Assessing

- The Assessing Department is continuing the FY18 Residential Exemption implementation and review process.
- Statutory Exemption and Residential Exemption applications continue to be accepted until April 1, 2018 at 4:00pm.

Council on Aging

- The Town of Truro and the Truro Council on Aging (COA) have launched a survey of those 55 and over to better assess how we can make Truro an even better place to live whether you live here year round or on a part-time basis.
