## **Department News:**

Police Department

The Truro Police Department will be taking back unwanted prescription drugs on Saturday April 28, 2018 at the Truro Public Safety Facility. The Truro Police Department, in partnership with the Drug Enforcement Administration, will give the public the opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. If you can't make it on Saturday, please remember that the Truro Police Department maintains a drug turn-in kiosk in our lobby which is accessible 24/7 year round. Last April, Americans turned in 450 tons (900,000 pounds) of prescription drugs at almost 5,500 sites operated by the DEA and more than 4,200 of its state and local law enforcement partners. Overall, in its 14 previous Take Back events, DEA and its partners have taken over 9 million pounds – more than 4,500 tons of unwanted and potentially dangerous prescription drugs in for proper destruction. This initiative addresses a vital public safety public health issue.

#### **Department of Public Works**

- The Transfer Station will be open 7 days a week beginning May 1, 2018. The Swap Shop will remain open three days a week, Saturday, Sunday, and Monday. The Swap Shop will be closed Tuesday through Friday.
- Scale assembly has been completed; staff has been trained on scale operations and data reporting. The scale has been evaluated, and permitted by the State. Staff will begin weighing in all commercial business on Friday, May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2018.
- Annual Transfer Station permits go on sale May 1, 2018. Permits may be purchased online through the Town website, or over the counter at Town Hall.
- Over the next few weeks, beach set-up for the spring and summer season will begin. Bike racks, portable bathrooms, trash and recycling containers will start to arrive at all beach and park locations.
- DPW Director Cabral met with Health and Conservation Agent Beebe to discuss the future layout of Concert Park and the Farmers Market area.
- Standard roads and grounds spring clean-up has begun. Over the next month you will see DPW crews mowing, street sweeping, marking parking lots and roads, clearing brush, and spreading loam over damaged area.

- At low tide, Shellfish Constable Jackett walked the flats and moved shellfish stock as needed.
