#### Police Department

• The Truro Police Department announced its participation in the "Battle of the Badges" Blood Drive. It is scheduled for August 2, 2018 from 12:30pm – 5:00 pm at the Truro Community Center. All donations are used to assist the Cape Cod community.

## Department of Public Works

- The Transfer Station is open 7 days a week. The Swap Shop is open three days a week, Saturday, Sunday, and Monday, and is closed Tuesday through Friday.
- The Selection Committee for the DPW Feasibility study has been issued all submitted proposals for review.
- DPW Director Cabral, along with Town Manager Palmer, has met with local business owners to review the DOT proposed drainage plan for Highland Road.
- Solid waste tonnage for FY 18 has declined by 161 tons when compared to FY 17. Recycling has increased a total of 145 tons when compared to FY 17. The recycling total is the highest total on record.

## Harbor Master

- We continue to be busy at the harbor with recreational fishermen and charter boats going out of the harbor (legal size recreational keeper is 28" long). Fishing continues for commercial bass fishermen with bigger fish (fish need to be 34" long to sell).
- Sebastian Frawley started this week as the 3<sup>rd</sup> Assistant Harbor Master and was welcomed by our Pamet Harbor boating community and is being trained (so far so good).
- Harbor Master Jackett and two assistants moved about (10) deep water basin floats to optimize spacing
  now that many boats are on floats. We will continue to adjust our floats and moorings with the aid of
  our new boat (from last year) with the winch to pull the 1,000 pound chain and cement blocks.
- Harbor Master Jackett and staff are continuing to review the Harbor Regulations and Shellfish Regulations for future meetings.
