- Staff and I met again this week to finalize the procedure for year-round condominium conversions. After some finishing touches, we will present the process to the Board of Selectmen at their regular meeting on June 26, 2018.
- I met with the Provincetown Town Manager to discuss shared challenges, and the final report on shared services from Matrix Consulting Group.
- As part of the existing Inter-municipal Agreement between Truro and Provincetown, we are able to assist
 each other with short term needs. The Provincetown Town Manager and I recently signed an agreement
 for the Provincetown Assessor to provide technical assistance to Truro's Assessing Office.
- As a reminder, annual Transfer Station permits expire June 30, 2018. Permits may be purchased online through the Town website or over the counter at the Truro Beach Office or Town Hall.
- Dr. Barry Bluestone will be presenting the Senior Needs Survey results at the Board of Selectmen meeting on June 12th.
- Although Town Meeting voters overwhelmingly voted for a Charter Change to change the name of the Board of Selectmen to Select Board, that change cannot take effect until it is approved on the May 2018 General Election ballot.

Department News:

Department of Public Works

- The Transfer Station is open 7 days a week. The Swap Shop will remain open three days a week;
 Saturday, Sunday, and Monday and closed Tuesday through Friday.
- The Transfer Station Scale is now fully operational. All commercial entities are required to weigh solid waste and recyclables.
- Life Guard stands were delivered to Head of the Meadow Beach followed by shade structures, and portable bathrooms to all beach locations. Miniature Libraries have also been dispersed to all beach locations, completing the annual beach set-up for the season.
- Over the next couple of weeks fresh parking paint markings will be installed for all beach locations and Town buildings.
- The new single stream hopper at the Transfer Station will be reinstalled next week, allowing all
 commercial haulers the ability to tip recyclables. In addition, DPW staff will be able to tip recyclables
 that are deposited in the smaller compactor. This will result in significant fuel and DPW man-hour
 savings.
- Seasonal roadway mowing will begin next week and continue through the summer season. The mower will begin in the southern part of Town and progress from there.
- DPW Director Cabral has contacted the RTA, DOT, and the Plymouth & Brockton Bus company to inquire about the bus stop on the corner of Shore Road and Highland. The bus stop is currently used by the Plymouth & Brockton Bus Company, but shares no maintenance responsibility with the Town, and the benches are owned by the RTA which has changed locations. The DPW will monitor and maintain the roadside at the location.

- After the first month of scale operation at the Transfer Station, revenue from billable commercial solid waste has doubled when compared to May of 2017.
