- Secretary of Housing and Economic Development, Jay Ash, visited the Pamet Harbor on Monday morning to get an update on how the Town will use the \$90,000 dredging grant awarded by the Commonwealth. Chairman Robert Weinstein, Selectperson Kristen Reed and Harbor Commissioner Rich Wood attended along with staff.

Department of Public Works

- The Swap Shop is scheduled to be closed for removal and replacement beginning, October 30, 2018. Replacement will include remediation work required by DEP. The Transfer Station will be closed Wednesday and Thursday beginning November 1, 2018.
- Seasonal brush cutting continued this week along Town roads, and will continue through the month of November.
- The DPW Director and Conservation Agent held a kick-off meeting this week with the Woods Hole Group regarding the Little Pamet Culvert and watershed area. The focus moving forward will be to model the appropriate size culvert, restoration alternatives, and drainage for the watershed area.
- The DPW Feasibility Study begins next Wednesday with a project kick-off meeting and Staff interviews.

Harbor Master

- Shellfish samples that were collected in shellfish areas and tested for harvest at the State lab were approved by the Division of Marine Fisheries. The November 4th opening day of the Pamet Harbor Shellfish Beds is dependent on water quality approval and lab results expected this Friday.

 - Avoid swimming early and late in the day (when sharks tend to feed).
 - Swim in groups.
 - Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to a shark).
 - Avoid surfing alone.
 - Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
 - Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.

Coastal Flooding Definitions

We've all heard the terms: Minor, Moderate and Major coastal flooding, but what does that mean?



Minor Coastal Flooding ...

Minor flooding of near shore roads, but most roads remain open and passable. A few very vulnerable basements and shore roads will see some flooding but the water depth is shallow.

Coastal Flood Advisories are issued.



Moderate Coastal Flooding ...

Flooding of near shore roads, many are closed around high tide. Many vulnerable basements are flooded. Water may be 1-3 feet deep. Some damage of structures such as decks, porches, or weakened sea walls. Coastal Flood Watches or Warnings are issued.



Major Coastal Flooding ...

Significant flooding of many shore roads & basements, more than 3 feet deep. Many roads impassable and may be washed out, isolating some neighborhoods. Structural damage to homes and sea walls likely.

Evacuations may be necessary! There is a significant threat to life and property. Coastal Flood Watches or Warnings are issued.
