Department News:

Police Department

- Truro Police Department would like to recognize and thank Dispatch Supervisor Heidi Dyer for her work that led to the department receiving awards of separate State 9-1-1 grants. These grants provide funding for dispatch support and emergency medical dispatch training. These funds also help cover required continuing education costs and EMD training expenses for our telecommunicators.
- Dispatch Supervisor Heidi Dyer also received a letter of compliance from State 9-1-1. All of Truro Police Department's telecommunicators have successfully completed their annual certification for FY2018 and are up to date with continuing education requirements.
- The application period for police officer candidates has closed. The next step will be a written examination scheduled for October 20, 2018.
- Thank you to all of our community members who took part in "Coffee with Cops" at Savory & the Sweet Escape on October 3rd. A very special thank you to our friends at Savory for sponsoring this wonderful event.

Fire Department

- The Department responded to 14 requests for medical assistance, resulting in 11 transports to the hospital. In all we responded to a total of 28 calls that included inspectional services, general assistance, alarm activations and calls for public service and good intent calls.
- The Department responded to a report of a missing swimmer on Saturday. The individual was not swimming but walking on the beach when he was struck by a wave and carried into the ocean. Multiple agencies were deployed for a search and rescue operation. Unfortunately they were unable to locate the individual. His body was recovered the following day approximately 1 mile North of Ballston Beach. Members of the Truro Fire Department extend their condolences to the family during this difficult time.
- The Department continues to train on a company level focusing on basic firefighter tactics and skills. We recently conducted training on rural water supply using multiple water tanks to supply water for firefighting operations. (see photo)
- FF's Anderson, Ferguson and Souza are halfway through their Fire Instructor 1 program at the Barnstable County Fire Academy.

Department of Public Works

- Volunteer shifts to staff the Swap Shop are currently available; please visit the Swap Shop to sign up. Shifts are available in two hour increments. No shifts have been filled.
- The Swap Shop is scheduled to be closed for removal and replacement beginning October 30, 2018. Replacement will include remediation work required by DEP.
- The Little Pamet tide gate was replaced this week; in addition the upstream end of the same culvert was repaired. The new tide gate will provide an increase in drainage to the watershed area.
- DOT completed the cleaning of the drainage system on Highland Road this Monday; DOT also continued the survey of the same area.
- Seasonal beach break down continued this week, warning signs regarding shark activity will be left up at all beach locations. Bike racks, and shade structures will be removed next week.
- The Town and the Woods Hole Group have scheduled a kick-off meeting regarding the Little Pamet Watershed area. The primary concern being culvert sizing, and flow control alternatives to allow for better drainage over the lifetime of the area and potential new structure.
- In collaboration with the Center for Coastal Studies, Harbor Master Tony Jacket, and DPW staff, the Pamet Harbor tide staff was installed today to monitor significant storm surge events. The height of the tide staff was based on the Pamet Harbor Tidal datums, and tidal profile, along with the storm of record storm surge plus three feet. The top of the tide staff represents the storm of record plus three feet. Pamet Harbor is now only the second harbor in Barnstable County to have a tide staff installed to measure storm events.

Harbor Master

- The Harbor was busy with many boats launching to fish for tuna and hauling out for the season.
- The Harbor Master spent the week preparing shellfish nets and setting shellfish seed into shellfish areas.
- The Harbor Master worked with DPW setting up a tide gauge attached to the main dock.

 - Warning Recent shark sightings at ocean side beaches, practice shark safety.
 - Don't swim where seals are present.
 - Don't swim too far from shore.
 - Avoid swimming early and late in the day (when sharks tend to feed).
 - Swim in groups.
 - Avoid wearing shiny jewelry or other accessories (which look like fish scales to a shark).
 - Avoid surfing alone.
 - Avoid areas with signs of baitfish or fish feeding activity watch for diving seabirds.
 - Be aware that sharks may be present between sandbars or near steep drop offs.
